Ohio Harness Horsemen's Association MGM Northfield Park Charity Night A Huge Success

Grove City, OH – Keys to Serenity left MGM Northfield Park Saturday night with big smiles and a check for \$10,000 as the winner at the Ohio Harness Horsemen's Association's third charity night of the year. Nine Cleveland area charities benefited from the generosity of the Ohio horseman.

The charities participating in the event were each paired with a horse in the fourth race. Each charity received a donation from the OHHA for participating, with the top three finishers receiving larger donations. First place received \$10,000, second place received \$5,000, and third place \$3,000. All other finishers received \$2,000 donations.
