Harold James Moore "Hal" passed away on January 29, 2024, at the age of 78. Born on August 17, 1945, in Toledo, OH, Harold was the son of the late Arlyn and Genevieve (Ridenour) Moore. He married Peggy Stockwell in 1969. She survives.

Hal led a rich and fulfilling life, marked by his dedication to his chosen profession as an accountant and his love of standardbred horses. He graduated from Eastwood High School in 1963 and went on to earn his bachelor's degree in Accounting from Bowling Green State University in 1969.
